Curriculum Policy

Scope of Policy: Whole School

Relationship to Schools Mission/Vision/Aims:

Blackwater Community School is committed to quality education. It aims to create caring community where students feel cherished, secure, and happy. It aims to give students access to a broad and balanced education and to develop their academic, physical, emotional, and spiritual potential to the full. These aims inform all teaching and learning in the school.

Rationale:

Goals: What is the policy intended to achieve?

The curriculum in Blackwater Community School aims to provide opportunities for all students to learn and to achieve within a supportive and formative environment. It sets out to develop enjoyment of and commitment to, learning as a means of encouraging and stimulating the best possible progress and the highest attainment for all students. It builds on students' strengths, interests and experiences and develops their confidence in their capacity to learn and work independently and collaboratively. It equips them with essential learning skills for life.

The curriculum also aims to promote students spiritual, moral, social, physical, emotional, and cultural development and prepares all students for the opportunities, responsibilities, and experiences of life. It strives to pass on enduring values, develop students' integrity and autonomy and help them to be responsible and caring citizens capable of contributing to the development of a just society.

The curriculum delivered draws on the aesthetic and creative, the ethical, linguistic, mathematical, physical, scientific, and technological, the social, environmental, political and spiritual domains. Blackwater Community School implements the curriculum in an innovative way with commitment and energy.

PROGRAMMES ON OFFER**Junior Cycle**

Junior Cycle (students 12-15 years, 3-year cycle). In line with the New Junior Cycle students will study a maximum of 10 subjects for State Examination. Students will study the three core subjects, Irish, English, Maths, Science, History and Religious Studies which will be discontinued as an exam subject from June 2020 along with 4 other subjects from the following list:

French – German – Business Studies – Home Economics – Materials Technology Wood – Materials Technology Metal – Music – Art, Craft and Design – Technical Graphics – Geography

Irish, English & Maths may be taken at Higher or Ordinary level while all other subjects will be examined at Common Level (as subjects are rolled out, to be completed by 2022).

All students will partake in the new area of learning called Wellbeing, which includes PE / SPHE / CSPE / Guidance from September 2017. Wellbeing is **not** for examination by the State Exams Commission.

In addition to the above changes, as per the New Junior Cycle, as and from September 2021 classes at BCS will be 60 minutes duration, reducing our current number of classes from 42 class periods a week to 29 periods a week.

AEN Support: additional support is given to student who qualify based for additional help in literacy, numeracy, or specific subjects. Homework club is also provided to assist students with their assignments.

Senior Cycle

Transition Year (15 years + - one year programme)

Leaving Certificate Established (2-year cycle)

Subjects on offer: *English, Maths, Irish, History, Geography, Religious Education, French, German, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Agricultural Science, Applied Maths, Business, Accounting, Construction Studies, Engineering, Music, Art, Design and Communication*

Graphics, Home Economics Social and Scientific and Economics. These subjects can be taken at all levels (Higher, Ordinary and Foundation where applicable)

Other subjects (non-exam): PE, Religious Education, Learning to Learn Programme. Career Guidance.

Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme 2-year cycle

Subjects on offer: as above but specialist groupings must be considered.

These are:

1. *Construction Studies or Engineering or Technical Drawing or Technology*
2. *Physics and Construction Studies or Engineering or Technology*
3. *Agricultural Science and Construction Studies or Engineering or Technology*
4. *Agricultural Science and Chemistry or Physics*
5. *Home Economics or Agricultural Science or Biology*
6. *Home Economics and Art*
7. *Accounting or Business or Economics*
8. *Physics and Chemistry*
9. *Biology and Chemistry or Physics*

Link Modules:

Leaving Certificate Applied (2-year cycle)

Subjects studied include:

English and Communication, Social Education, Technology Agriculture, Horticulture, Engineering Mathematical Applications, Modern languages, Hotel Catering and Tourism, Active Leisure Studies, Religious Education, Science, Vocational Preparation & Guidance, Drama, Music, Introduction to Information & Communication Technology, Leisure & Recreation, Arts Visual, Communicative Irish (LCA1), Language Module (LCA2),

Subject Choice Arrangements

Subject Options: Junior Cycle

Students make option subject choices before coming into 1st year 6 of the following are selected: Art, Home Economics, Woodwork, Metalwork, Music & Tech Graphics, French, German, Business Studies, and Geography. In 2nd & 3rd year the core subjects of Irish, English and Maths are run concurrently for all class groups, facilitating flexibility and movement of students between levels within these class groups. All optional subjects in the Junior Cycle are mixed ability in nature.

Subject Options: Senior Cycle

Students have tasters of some subjects/modules in TY. During TY we have a senior options evening for parents whereby all optional subjects are discussed with Parents and Students of TY and 3rd year students not doing TY (the following year)

They then attend a senior options presentation from our career guidance teacher on the implication of subject choice and requirements of various careers. This is reinforced by access in class to REACH + and careers portal etc during TY. Students entering 5th year must select 1 subject for each of 4 bands. These bands are drawn up on the basis of student demand following completion of a preference form i.e. some subjects appear once while others appear 2 to 3 times.

Curriculum Supports

Supervised Study

This is provided 5 evenings a week from 4.00 to 6.00pm and from 6.30 to 8.00 – Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and from 1.30 – 5.00 pm on Wednesday - on Friday evening study is between 4.00 – 6.30. Supervised study is provided from 9.00am – 1.00pm during Halloween, Christmas, February and Easter holiday period.

Homework Club

This is provided 2 evenings a week from 3.45 to 4.45 for the SEN students in the Junior Cycle. Two teachers typically work during this session, helping students as the need arises. This service is free.

Class Size

There are up to 30 students in general subject classes, 24 in practical subjects and 20 in Home Economics. In the Special Needs area, class size depends on individual needs varying from 1-1 and small groups.

Subject Planning

Each Subject Department has its own Subject Plan. A copy of these Plans is kept in the staffroom in the general filing cabinet. The coordination of the team is rotated yearly. The team meets on a regular basis throughout the year. This allows for a review and evaluation to be carried out each year. It also included on recommendations from any previous Subject Inspection in their respective areas.

Planning for ICT

ICT is integrated across the Curriculum in Blackwater Community School. The quality of teaching and learning is enhanced through the use of interactive whiteboards, a networked computer system, two dedicated computer rooms, laptops, iPad etc.

The ICT Programme aims to equip students with the skills and knowledge necessary for the use of ICT in the modern world. In school it enables students to carry out assignments, project work, homework and exam questions using ICT.

The Programme includes the following

School Assessment

Summative Assessment is carried out four times a year, at the end of October, Christmas, Easter and Summer. These reports are sent home at these times. Copies of the reports are kept on file in the office.

The results included are

- a) Subject Teacher Comment
- b) Comment for Overall Effort at the Subject
- c) Grade and Mark

Formative assessment takes place on a regular basis in all subject areas.

Mentoring of students is carried out after each assessment period for State Exam candidates. Student results are collated and ranked after each assessment. The mentoring team meet with the students individually to trace progress and to advise about the future.

Roles and Responsibilities

The School Management is responsible for ensuring that the Curriculum is provided in accordance with the guidelines as set down by the DES.

Each Subject Department Coordinator ensures that the curriculum for each subject is followed accordingly. Individual teachers are responsible in the carrying out of the same.

Monitoring, Review and Evaluation

- The Principal is responsible for ensuring that the Curriculum Policy is implemented in the school.
- The Policy is reviewed every year
- The review is carried out by the School Development Planning Committee
- Assessment and monitoring of the Policy are carried out on a regular basis by the SDP team.
